ELEMENTS OF A PARAGRAPH

- **Topic Sentence**- introduces the main idea & makes a claim-takes a position that will be proven
- **Evidence**: facts, documents, examples, etc. that thoroughly PROVE the CLAIM in the topic sentence of the paragraph
- **Analysis**- author's comments pointing out connections, relationships, similarities, differences- extending the evidence to further PROVE the CLAIM in the topic sentence
- **Concluding Statement**- reminds reader that claim has been proven & explains importance, pulls paragraph together, & often has a transition to the next topic sentence



Topic Sentences	Includes a specific topic & takes a position that can be proven; reinforces thesis  Strong, Sophisticated language	Includes a specific topic & takes a position that can be proven; specifically reference a key concept that matches the thesis Strong language	Missing or too general topic sentences that may not relate to the thesis Simple, weak language
Evidence	Abundant, credible, relevant and compelling evidence from textbook, docs, notebook etc. (4 or more)	Reliable and mostly relevant evidence (3 or more)	Little to no evidence that is questionable or irrelevant (less than 3)
Analysis	Complex, thoughtful analysis of the evidence is used to prove the topic sentence/thesis	Evidence is connected to the questions and/or issues raised by the prompt	General discussion of topic
Closing statement	reminds reader that the topic sentence is true, pulls evidence together, & transitions to the next paragraph	reviews major ideas, & pulls evidence together	missing or simply restates the topic sentence
