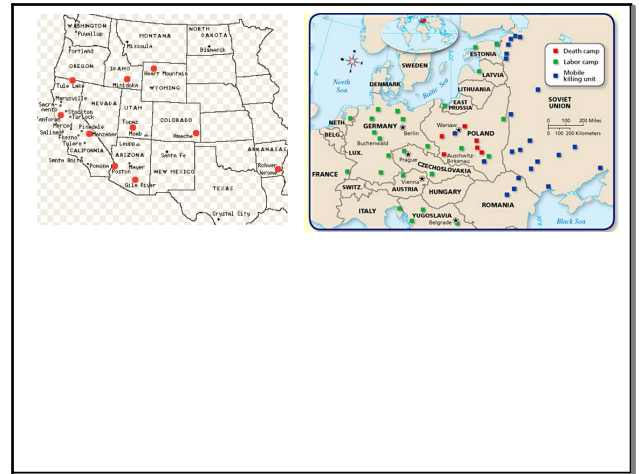

Stages of the Holocaust

1) Boycott of Jewish Businesses (1933)
Hitler announces a boycott of all Jewish businesses. This isolates Jews both socially and economically from German society.

2) Kristallnacht (1938)
On November 10, 1938, Nazi officials unleash a savage nationwide campaign of terror against Germany's Jewish population. Many Jews are killed and hundreds of Jewish shops and synagogues are destroyed. 30,000 Jews are arrested and sent to prison camps.

3) Nuremberg Laws (1935)
Laws are passed depriving German Jews of their citizenship and banning marriages between Jews and non-Jews. All Jews are forced to wear a yellow star of David so they can be identified.

4) Jewish Ghettos (1939)
Ghettos, or confined areas within a city, are established in occupied eastern Europe. Jews are forced from their homes and required to live in ghettos.

5) Deportation throughout Europe (1942-1945)
Nazis systematically round up Jews throughout Europe and transport them to death camps in Eastern Europe.

6) Final Solution (1942-1945)
Nazi officials agree to move forward with a plan to kill all European Jews. Death camps are built specifically for this purpose. Deportation for this purpose.

7) Liberation (1944-1945)
Allied troops liberate, c. free, approximately 300,000 Jews from the concentration and death camps.

Timeline: 1933 (Elected), 1939 (World War II begins), 1945 (World War II ends)

Additional notes: Jews and other enemies of the Nazis are imprisoned. From 1942 on, Jews are systematically moved to death camps, built specifically to exterminate Jews.
