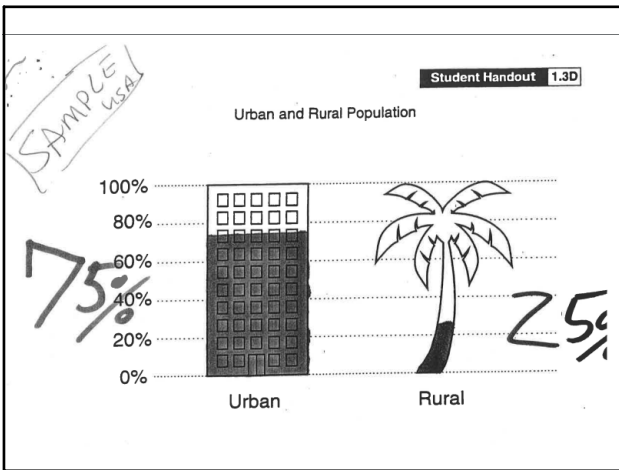

 Cuba covers an area of 42,800 square miles.
 Cuba was a Spanish colony until 1898, and then a United States colony until it won independence in 1902.

Graphs

- Spanish is the official language of Cuba.
- Cuba has a literacy rate of 97%.
- The population of Cuba is 51% Creole, 37% European, 11% African and 1% Chinese.
- Religion is not officially recognized in Communist Cuba; prior to 1959 the population of Cuba was 85% Roman Catholic and 15% other.
- Cuba's population is 75% urban and 25% rural.
- Cuba's annual per capita income is \$4,100.
