Phase I- Old (Ancien) Regime	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Financial Crisis of 1789 pushed France toward Revolution
Phase II- National Assembly	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> While waiting for National Assembly to finish the new Constitution of 1791-accepted beheadings & violence.
Phase III- Reign of Terror	<p>Marat</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Robspierre (The Incorruptable)--- New gov.-everyone gets to vote (universal suffrage) & ends slavery
