 African National Congress nonviolent, political organization opposed to white domination






 Soweto Township – students peacefully protesting use of Afrikaans as a tool of dominance killed (700)



 STEVE BIKO-Black Consciousness Movement (black pride/negritude) leader dies in prison from brutal beatings








• DESMOND TUTU-wins Nobel Peace Prize for work against apartheid

Undoing of Apartheid

1984- some reforms were introduced • 1985- S. African gov't declared state of emergency 1990- lift bans and restrictions, released Mandela 1990-1991: appartheid abolished 1992: last whites only vote in S. Africa 1993: Constituion w/ freedom of speech, religion and prohibiting discrimintation • 1994: first all-race vote in S. Africa- Mandela wins presidency
